

Questions for Classroom Discussion

Making Up Snow Days

Why is it important to have a set number of days for the school year?

- consider the need for equal instruction time across a school district, a state, and the entire nation
- consider how the length of the school day has an impact on planning and scheduling
- consider how a predictable schedule can help student learning

What are ways that missing school days due to inclement weather can have an impact student learning?

- consider the amount of material that teachers must cover throughout the year, and how time is limited
- consider the need for schools to focus on other areas aside from the core subjects (PE, Art, Music, etc.), and how extra time must be allowed for these areas
- consider the necessity for the education system in our country to compete with the systems in other countries, and how many countries have longer school years

What are possible ways that time lost due to inclement weather can be made-up later in the school year?

- consider options for making up full days, such as turning work-days into studentdays, as well as going to school on holidays
- consider the possibility of extending the school year
- consider alternative options, such as adding time to each school day, adjusting the schedule within a school day (such as reducing time focused on PE, Art, and Music), or even having students make-up work at home via the internet
