## **Teacher Instructions:**

**Problem Scenario:** "The Next Big Stunt"

The Main Problem: You are a stuntperson preparing for the next great

daredevil trick. What should this trick be, and what

needs to be considered as you prepare for it?

Your students will be viewing this problem from an integrated perspective.



## What goes into creating the next big stunt?

Students will decide why a specific stunt should be chosen (publicity, world records, excitement, etc.), and what factors (planning, safety, regulations, etc.) must be considered for the stunt to take place.

\*\*Students should take notes as they review the Stimulus Items

Lead a **class discussion** about issues related to the topic. You are being provided a sheet to help you guide the classroom discussion.

**Extended Responses:** Have students answer the following questions using the online assessment system. Remind students to use information from the Stimulus Items to support their response.

- 1. If you are a daredevil, what would you choose as your "next big stunt"? Explain why the choice is best for you and your intended audience.
- 2. After your "next big stunt" is chosen, what needs to be considered to make sure it goes as planned? What can you do to ensure success?

**EXTENDED PRODUCTS (Optional)**: Students should design a poster promoting the "next big stunt" that they have chosen. The poster should explain what the stunt will be and why it is so impressive, and it should also convince the public to come out and witness it. Students must decide what will catch the attention of the people (i.e. is it for a charity, or to set a world record, or just truly outrageous). Students can also write a letter to the Town Council where the stunt will take place to convince them that it will be safe (both for the daredevil and for spectators) and under control.



Rubrics to grade student entries have been provided, and all questions have been mapped to the content standards. Results can be analyzed through the online system.
