Students will review the current voting criteria, as well as arguments for and against young children being involved in politics and even voting.

Stimulus Item #3 — "Should Children Follow Politics?" (online discussion)

Step Classroom

Discussion

Lead a **class discussion** about issues related to the topic. You are being provided a sheet to help you guide the classroom discussion.

Extended Responses: Have students answer the following questions. Remind students to use information from the Stimulus Items to support their response.

- 1. How would politics change if the minimum voting age were lowered from 18 to 10? What if there was no minimum voting age at all?
- 2. The minimum voting age is currently 18 years old for federal elections. What should it be, and why?

EXTENDED PRODUCT (Optional): Divide students into small groups, and tell them that the minimum voting age for the next presidential election has been lowered to 8 years old (for this exercise only, of course!). Have each group organize the campaign for a candidate, with the goal of winning the youth

vote. The groups must consider what issues the politicians should focus on, as well as the events they should host. The groups can write a short television campaign ad for the candidate that is aimed at children. As a class, discuss whether having children vote would improve or hurt the democratic process.
