Based on the details and cost of the different alarm systems, what is the best way to notify everyone at your school during an emergency?	
Make sure to use the information that you've reviewed to support your answer.	
There is technology today that will call you on your cell phone or send a text whenever there is danger. That's fine, but it's not the best way to get your attention. A good old-fashioned siren is still the best way to alert people to danger. There are several reasons for this. A sound alarm (or "siren") is much less costly, is less likely to be ignored, and is more reliable than some of the more advanced alarm systems. This is especially true at a school, where students and teachers need a simple way of knowing that there is trouble. If it is complicated in any way (such as sending teachers a text message), there is far too much room for error when student safety is involved. A loud, clear siren is by far the quickest way to get everyone's attention. Of course, cost is also a factor. A large siren might cost \$5,000 for installation, and need to be tested twice a year at \$100 per test. This is a real cost that must be fitted into the budget, but it is small when compared to the
