Let's Take a Vacation!

- **What are your different options for spending your next vacation?**
 - ⇒ Consider usual “vacation” activities, such as sight-seeing, relaxing, theme parks, etc.
 - ⇒ Consider previous vacations, and how they might be a good indicator of future vacations
 - ⇒ Consider new experiences that you may take on with future vacations, such as taking tours, volunteering, or travelling to new places

- **What are the limiting factors that will decide what you can (or can't) do on a vacation?**
 - ⇒ Consider that many of the final decisions about how you spend your time is often at the hands of your parents, and how their desires may differ from yours
 - ⇒ Consider that many activities often cost money or are in far away locations, forcing you to have to prioritize among them
 - ⇒ Consider that the schedule of other people (such as parents and siblings) often dictates the destination, type, and activities of a vacation

- **What are ways that your time could be used more productively on your vacation?**
 - ⇒ Consider the possibility of trying something new during a vacation, or possibly “pushing your limits”
 - ⇒ Consider taking time to volunteer during your vacation time for a cause that you would be proud to support
 - ⇒ Consider reading books, taking lessons, or attending camps that are focused on your interests and enable you to improve yourself
